Ann came to Kenana Knitters in 2006, she was introduced to the knitters by her Aunt Mary Amuria. At the time, Ann was going through a rough time with her husband who had become hostile, abusive and had completely refused to provide for Ann and their two children. Many times he would leave for work and there would be no money for food and other necessities for her and the children

When she came to Kenana, she had already learnt the basic knitting from her aunt and was ready to learn how to read patterns. Her income from the Knitters has enabled her to provide food and education for her children. She has invested in a plot of land where the family has built a permanent home. Her income also enables her to rent a shamba (farm) where they plant maize and beans for the family.

Ann is now a mother of 6 children, 5 girls and 1 Boy.

I am grateful to Kenana because it has changed my life and that of my children. . Since I joined the knitters we have never gone hungry and my children have never been chased away from school.
